

FENCING FOR THE LODGE

Brethren, We have been having security issues at the lodge over the last few months. We have discussed these at the lodge during the stated meeting. For those that have not been to lodge, this is a short list of just some of the issues.

· Flivers trailer was broken into and a flivers car stolen. It was recovered. Also the big trailer was

broken into also.

· Someone ripped the security camera off the back door and threw it into the desert.

· Multiple people have come onto the property and had to be trespassed to get them to leave.

A lot of these problems are because we are having a lot more homeless living in the area and they travel past the lodge to get to Circle-K.

We are doing fundraising to get money to put a fence up around the front half of the property. It will have two gates along Gemini and chainlink across the front. We will then have fencing go down both sides to a point behind the garage and then close it in across behind the garage.

This fencing will run between \$15,000 and \$25,000. We are doing some fund raising events and also asking for members that are able to help to send in money for the building fund.

By installing the fencing, we should be able to determost of the issues that we have been having.
