

- · November also gives us a reminder of remembrance and duty: Veterans Day (11 Nov) resonates with the Masonic values of service and sacrifice. One Masonic commentary notes how "memory, ritual and sacrifice converge within our Masonic tradition" in this month.
- · As Masons, we speak often of Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth. November invites us to extend "Relief" beyond Lodge walls to our Brothers who may be absent, to families in need, to our community at large. serves as a living allegory for the journey of man, the work of the Lodge, and the responsibilities of the Craft.

In spring, we are like Entered Apprentices—just beginning our labors, full of zeal and expectation. Summer reflects the Fellowcraft—our hands busy in building, learning, and shaping our work. But in autumn, we enter a time of reflection, like the Master Mason, gathering the fruits of labor, considering what has been built, and preparing for the close of the year.

The harvest season reminds us of a central Masonic truth: we reap what we sow. If our efforts have been faithful, diligent, and true, then the harvest will be abundant. If we have neglected our duties or ignored the needs of our Lodge and our Brethren, the season will reveal that as well.

October is also a month of preparation. As nature prepares for winter, so too must we, as Masons, prepare for the future—mentoring younger Brothers, strengthening our Lodge, and ensuring that what we have built will endure long after us. A Brief Masonic Note to Share


