



The first of our group—five RVs strong—arrived early on Wednesday to stake our claim in the sand and set the tone for the weekend. Saturday brought a highlight of the weekend: the Trunk-or-Treat event, where our Lodge family proudly represented the Zelzah Shrine and Masonic community. We showcased the Shrine's six-wheel parade vehicle alongside Cameron's beloved "Fliver Car." Hundreds of

children and families came by for candy, smiles,



and photographs with the cars—a joyful outreach that reminded us of Masonry's purpose beyond the Lodge: to spread goodwill, joy, and light in the community.


