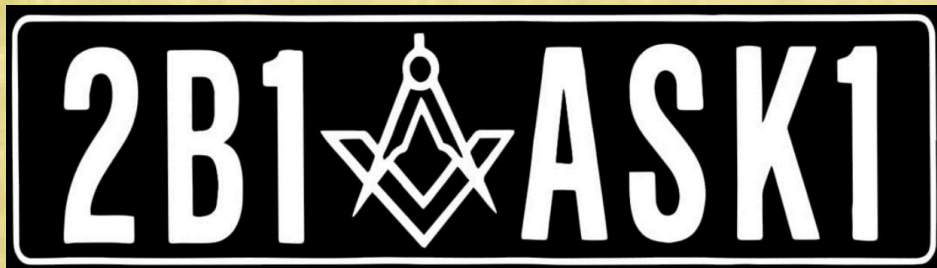

# *From the Senior Deacon*

## *Meeting Each Other on the Level*

*Brethren, One of the most powerful teachings in Freemasonry is found in a simple phrase that we hear often in Lodge: that we are to meet each other on the level. The Level is not just a working tool of the operative mason—it is a profound moral symbol for the speculative Mason. The Level reminds us that all men are equal in the eyes of the Great Architect of the Universe. Titles, wealth, status, and worldly achievements may separate men outside the Lodge, but when we enter this sacred space we stand together as Brothers.*

*The Level teaches us that no Brother is above another and no Brother is beneath another. Each of us comes from a different background, different life experiences, and different perspectives. Some of us are craftsmen, some are professionals, some are young in years, and some have walked the path much longer. Yet the Level reminds us that the value of a man is not measured by his position, but by his character.*

*In every Lodge there will be differences. Differences of opinion, differences in ideas, and differences in approach to the work of the Lodge. These differences are natural and, in many ways, they are healthy. Just as a structure becomes stronger when many stones come together, a Lodge becomes stronger when many minds and perspectives contribute to its growth. But Freemasonry teaches us that disagreement must never become division.*

*When we truly meet each other on the Level, we listen with respect. We speak with kindness. We seek understanding rather than victory. The Level teaches us humility—reminding us that we may not always be right, and that the wisdom of another Brother may help improve our own understanding.*

*Envy, pride, and resentment have no place within the walls of a Lodge. The Apprentice Pillar at Rosslyn Chapel reminds us that jealousy can destroy even the most beautiful work. In Masonry we are taught a better way: to admire the work of another Brother and learn from it rather than resent it. When one Brother succeeds, the Lodge succeeds. When one Brother grows, the Craft grows.*

*Meeting on the Level also means supporting one another through life's challenges. The world outside the Lodge can be difficult. Many Brothers carry burdens that we cannot see—family struggles, health concerns, financial pressures, or personal trials. Within the Lodge we are called to be a place of strength, compassion, and relief. When a Brother stumbles, we extend a hand. When a Brother suffers, we offer comfort. When a Brother succeeds, we celebrate together.*

*Brethren of Pahrump Lodge No. 54, the future of our Lodge depends not only on ritual or tradition, but on how we treat one another. If we truly practice Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth—if we truly meet on the Level—our Lodge will continue to grow in strength, unity, and purpose. Let us remember that the Level is not just a symbol placed upon the altar or displayed upon a jewel. It is a guide for how we live and how we treat one another. Let us leave this Lodge tonight committed to listening more, encouraging more, supporting more, and respecting one another more. For when we truly meet on the Level, we build not only a stronger Lodge—but better men.*

*Texan forces in a surprise attack against General Antonio López de Santa Anna's Mexican army. The battle lasted less than twenty minutes, and Santa Anna was captured the next day.*

*A popular legend claims that Santa Anna, who was also a Freemason through the Scottish Rite in Mexico, saved his life by flashing Masonic signals or giving a secret grip to Houston when he was presented to him. Houston recognized Santa Anna was far more useful alive to negotiate Texas' independence. Nevertheless, the battle remains a pivotal moment in history and a fascinating detail within the story of Freemasonry.*



**Masonic Education for Outdoor Degrees:** The Chuck Wagon was invented by Freemason Charles Goodnight in 1866. Bro. Col. Goodnight, a Texas Ranger and Cattleman, along with his partner and friend, Bro. Oliver Loving, a rancher, rounded up stray cattle from all over Texas and herded the Doggies to Bro. John Chisum's Spread near Fort Sumner in the New Mexico Territory. This would become known as the Goodnight-Loving Trail. He needed a conveyance for their Grub along the trail and the Chuck Wagon was born. The Brothers were members of Phoenix Lodge No. 275 in Weatherford, Texas, and are portrayed in the book and talking picture show **Lonesome Dove**.

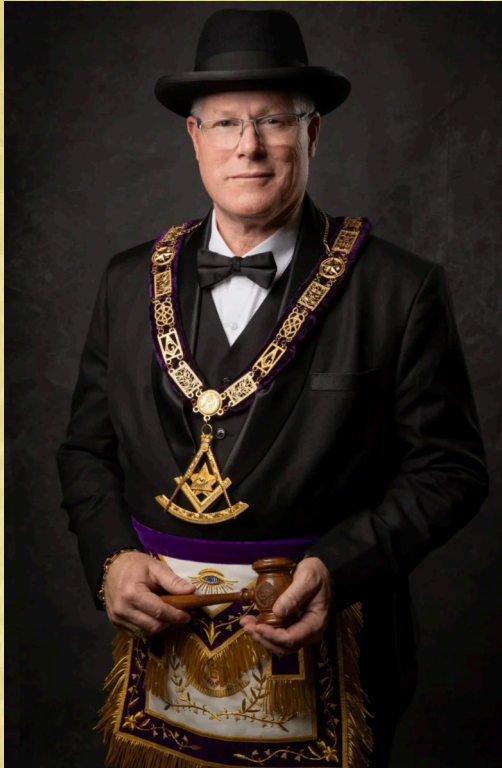
