*As reported at our April Stated Meeting our Lodge is in a pretty good overall financial position.*

*Gracious Donations has allowed Our Lodge to fully fund the HVAC (#3062) project without digging into our Reserve. The New unit and Thermostats have been installed and are working superbly. We also now can monitor the status of each unit remotely, allowing us to better manage the usage of A/C and Heating when we are not physically in the building.*

*We have also completed the Kitchen Hood Cleaning, Fire Suppression, and the Lodges Fire Extinguisher needs.*

*There was a request to have a fund-raising project for the replacement of the Kitchen's NSF refrigerator which died unexpectedly (thank you to WB Capa for loaning us one while re replace it. The approved expenditure on a new one is \$2,500.00. I have committed to a replacement for approximately \$2,100.00. Hope to have it in between 2-3 weeks. I have opened a Fund for this purpose (3013), if any brother wishes to help defray this cost. You can Zelle any donation and reference this account number (I also take cash).*

Just as a teacher may use symbolism, ritual, or allegory to impress a lesson upon the mind, Masonry uses its initiatic process to teach moral and spiritual truths in a memorable and transformative way.*

*The lessons of Freemasonry are not hidden because they are dangerous, but because discovery is part of the learning itself. A candidate who experiences the degrees firsthand gains insight through reflection, participation, and contemplation. The privacy surrounding these methods protects the integrity of that journey.*

*In a world where nearly everything is instantly revealed and consumed, Freemasonry reminds us that some truths are best learned gradually, personally, and with reverence. The Craft does not seek to conceal truth from mankind it seeks to prepare mankind to better understand truth within himself.*

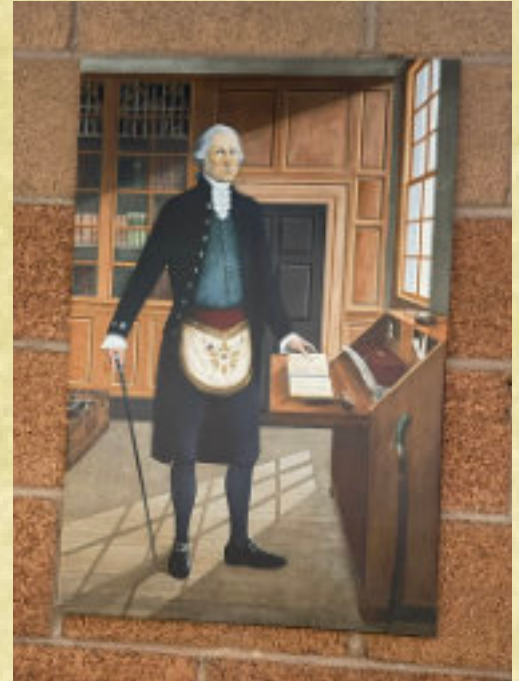
# Pahrump Lodge No. 54 Receives Society of Washington Lodges Membership

- A limited-edition painting of George Washington



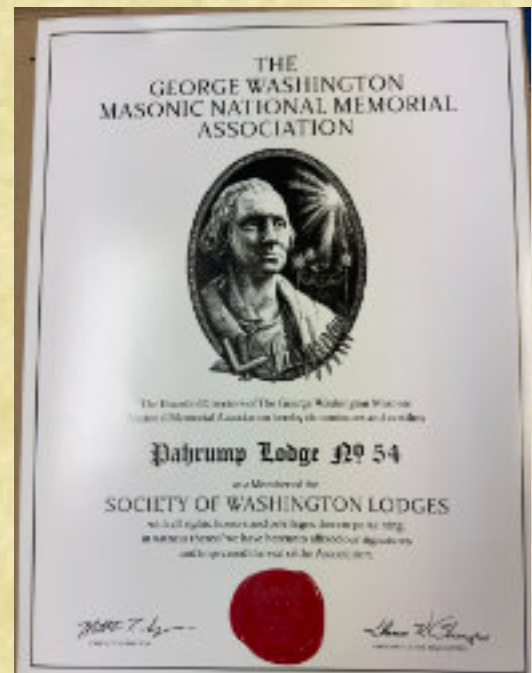
The painting has already been placed in the Lodge Room and is hanging on the North wall.
